Jeanne M. Santoli, MD, MPH, is the deputy director of the Immunization Services Division in the National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Her division administers the Vaccines for Children Program and a grants program to state and urban area health departments; conducts health services research; provides training and education to health professionals; provides for measurement of state and national level vaccination coverage via the National Immunization Survey; and supports the development and use of electronic immunization information systems.

Since 2003, Dr. Santoli has been one of the CDC staff members involved in planning for and responding to problems related to our nation's seasonal influenza vaccination program.

Dr. Santoli received her medical degree and training in pediatrics at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine in Baltimore, Maryland. Following her residency, Dr. Santoli completed a fellowship in General Academic Pediatrics and a Masters in Public Health at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health in Baltimore, Maryland.
